BEYOND THE NEWBORN HEARING SCREEN: KEYS TO SUCCESSFUL EARLY INTERVENTION

The purpose of this course is to discuss the critical aspects of a newborn hearing screening program and the necessary follow up that must be in place in order to be successful. These programs can be effective so long as key players are identified and communicating with one another and follow up steps are highlighted and understood for babies who do not pass their screenings. The positive impact of a universal newborn hearing screen is lost if the child never makes it to an Audiologist for appropriate intervention.

- Attendees will know who should be receiving the information when a baby fails and who has access to that information
- Attendees will know the importance of follow up and the timeline of events from screening, diagnostic testing, and intervention
